

ONCE YOU ARE SATISFIED THE CALLER IS LEGITIMATE AND YOU ARE COMFORTABLE ALLOWING THEM INTO YOUR HOME. DO NOT LEAVE THEM ON THEIR OWN. DO NOT LEAVE HANDBAGS, WALLETS, PURSES etc. ON SHOW.

Callers use various guises from gas men, electricity meter readers, council employees and on rare occasions Neighbourhood Watch members. If anyone does call, and you are suspicious, call the police immediately on 999.

Ivy on Grovehurst Oak Tree

Due to the ivy removal from the large oak tree it was agreed that the two smaller trees would also have ivy removal work done. Village advised Clerk Handyman to remove ivy from

the two smaller trees which are situated at the entrance of Cormorant Road

Vandalism in School Lane Playing Field

Clerk advised members that the work had been completed and the total cost to repair the roundabout was £1,193.12. and to replace the damaged wetpour totalled £1,000

Speed Watch in the Village

Community Police Officer Lindsay Woods advise the Parish Council that she had spoken to Warren Jarvis who deals with criminal damage, speeding vehicles, off road bikes etc and he was looking to set up projects around Kent but need the community to be involved.

It requires a minimum of 6 volunteers to assist and a fund of  $\pounds$ 2,000, then the community is set up with tripods which read vehicle number plates etc, the

computer then reads the speed. The aim of this project is to have more number plates and camera pictures of these offenders.

After a general discussion it was agreed that the Clerk would speak to PC Woods and obtain more information.


Barn Refurbishment

CHRISTMAS THOUGHTS - by Patience Strong.

All the world is young on Christmas Day. Our grown-up worries seem to melt away. There is a feeling that we can't explain - for we become like children once again.

The faith of childhood springs in us anew. Our hearts grow lighter, brighter, and warmer too. And life takes on a sweet simplicity. God comes so close not veiled in mystery - But as a child; a small and helpless thing.

The baby Christ, the little Savior-King This is thought that breaks down human pride the tender thought that comes at Christmas tide.

## All Saints Church

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it"

These words so familiar to many of us, used at the Christmas services, often in a darkened Church full of flickering candles. A traditional very evocative scene, but what does it really mean to any of us?

What difference do all the fairy lights, the presents, all the celebrations mean to each one of us?

Why when half the world eats too much, drinks too much and gets into debt, which will take a long time to pay off, do others starve and live in desperately poor conditions?

Is this the light which Jesus came into the world to bring, light and wealthy to a privileged few?

Emphatically NO.

Jesus came into this world to bring a pure light, which will shine in all the darkest corners, show up all that is wrong with the world and give us the chance to put it right. We use the symbols of candles a great deal at this time of the year, which is a dark time anyway. Many people in the last few days have said to me how gloomy this time of the year is and how easy it is to get depressed. Stand in a darkened area, especially a Church and light just one single candle. The light spreads out, but it is not a still light which has to be manipulated by man as a torch or a lamp, but a living moving flame which moves of it's own will and spreads light to different places at different times, even if you are only standing still.

The light that Jesus came to being is also a living light, the light, which brings hope to you when everything around you seems to be dark. There is a myth around that as Christians we live in a rosy glow and never have to face darkness and difficulty.

This is simply not the truth. Things do happen and Christians have to face dark times just as much as anyone else. The difference is that we have light in our lives we have the living flame within us, which will never be extinguished, even if we think it might at times. We are never alone, even if we think we are sometimes. God loves us all so much he sent His Son to earth for us, each one of us. He will never abandon us.

We have seen the light which overcomes the darkness and we WILL walk in it.

We look forward to welcoming as many as possible over the Christmas period to our churches. If anyone is in need of a visit or would like their communion brought to them please let the team know as soon as possible.
