## Broadband

Thanks to an exceptional turnout of 108 people at the KCC Public Broadband meeting on Tuesday 14th April KCC have agreed (in principle) to give Iwade a grant of up to £50000 to implement a wireless or satellite broadband solution. This will hopefully give residents more broadband options by providing a faster affordable service in addition to the current services available.

Iwade broadband users who are limited to access down a BT line (i.e. those who do not have access to cable) often receive a slow and intermittent service due to the distance from the telephone exchange and the old copper wires.

The grant will allow us to select a supplier and provide the capital for them to invest in the required infrastructure. Hopefully with some left over to subsidise any end user costs.

It's now down to the Iwade Broadband Committee to make it happen. Thank you to the residents who have volunteered for the committee. It's not often we get £50000 to spend!

If all goes to plan we should get supplier proposals from KCC in early July and take it from there.

Hillreed Homes would like to have Outline Planning Permission agreed by the end of 2009 for the Sheppey Way to School Lane development. They will then move into the Detailed Planning Permission process probably in 3 continuous phases as it's a large development. Hillreed will also be contacting Virgin Media to look at the feasibility of getting cable laid into the new development for broadband, television and telephone.

# Iwade Village Hall

All the residents of Iwade will be interested to read of what has been happening at their Village Hall during the past few months. First of all, since February, the Hall has had a full committee to run the affairs, a no mean task in the 21st century with all the rules and laws to abide by.

Secondly the committee has worked really hard to update the Terms and Conditions of the hire of the Hall to keep in line with the licence issued by Swale Borough Council. This applies to all hirers, Occasional hirers i.e. a one off party or meeting and Frequent hirers i.e. nursery groups and clubs. They will commence on 1st June 2009.

During the next few weeks the new Terms and Conditions of hire, together with an accompanying letter explaining the reasons in full will be sent to all Frequent users. This will include instructions concerning the invoicing of

the charges. You will be pleased to know that the cost of hiring the Village Hall has not increased, but will need to be reviewed during the coming year in accordance with the increases in the utilities at the Hall.

You may have observed that since February there have been many functions at the Hall, mostly run by the Hall committee. Please continue to support these events as they help to raise funds for the upkeep of the building. There is also a website [www.iwadevillage-hall.co.uk](http://www.iwadevillage-hall.co.uk) with lots of information and how to hire the hall.

Like many other organisations in Iwade, the Village Hall is run by volunteers who care about our village. How many of us walk or drive past the Hall every day without giving it a thought. Watch this space for an update in a few months time and watch the Hall too.

## Can you rely on the food chain?

I hope by now your garden is looking good, with all the new leaves healthy and bursting with life. However, these healthy leaves and shoots are lovely food for so many different pests. Slugs will go for your tender vegetable plants, and aphids will suck the life out of your roses. Hopefully you will have help with controlling these pests from their natural predators, thanks to the food chain. However I find that there is more than enough food to go around, and the pests often seem to win, unless I give a helping hand. Hedgehogs, although famed for eating slugs, will only do so if they are starving; they prefer beetles and caterpillars. Slugs carry lungworm, which is bad news for hedgehogs, so we can't rely on them to do the job. I have found that individual plants are protected by copper tape around sections of plastic drinks bottles. It's cheaper than buying copper rings, and seems to be working for my lettuce and kohlrabi; apparently the slugs get an electric shock which puts them off munching. Nematodes are also available, which are watered onto the soil and attack the slugs and kill them, but I have found they are not so effective on the clay soils around here as they would be elsewhere. Organic slug pellets are based on iron, so they may be another solution to the ever present problem. Trying to control aphids is another battle, spraying chemicals is one solution, but there are others. A jet of water will dislodge a good number, or a tiny squirt of washing up liquid in water will kill them, but aphids reproduce very quickly so you need to be vigilant. I have chillies and peppers on my kitchen windowsill, and find I need to look them over every day, squashing any greenfly I see. Other pests can be controlled organically too, with sprays based on chilli and/or garlic. These can be bought, or do some research and make your own.

Although we may never win the war, you can help your plants survive the battle. Happy Gardening!

# Parish Council Meeting Notes

from meeting of Tuesday 10th March 2009

## **Additional Letter Boxes in the Village**

A new post box will be installed at the top of School Lane at the junction of the new estate. Cllr Groves had suggested the letter-box outside the village Post Office be increased in size to accommodate the large volume of post. The Post Office has confirmed that this post box will remain the same as further funding is currently not available. There is nothing that Mr Patel, who runs the Post Office, can do about this. Security of the mail is a priority so they will continue to use a post bag inside the Post Office to collect any additional mail. Chairman Phil Fearn suggested we wait until the new box has been installed in School Lane before we discuss this subject any further. Cllr Dave Manning suggested the PC write to the Post Office. Cllr Derek White suggested reviewing this subject at the next meeting to be held in April. In the meantime liaise with Mr Patel to monitor the situation once the additional post box is installed. Cllr Janet Gregory commented that the Post Office had cut its collections in Iwade. All agreed to monitor the situation & discuss at the next meeting.

## **New Burial Ground**

At the parking meeting held on Monday 9th March it was suggested the use of the church car park. Cllr Janet Gregory suggested additional car parking be made available. Cllr Janet Gregory suggested extra parking be allocated & Cllr Ben Stokes would look into this & report back. Cllr Peter Wilks commented that neighbouring houses would end up using this additional car parking area. This subject is to be carried forward at the next meeting by Cllr Derek White & Cllr Janet Gregory.

## **Minutes of the meeting held in Borden (lighting grant)**

Cllr Phil Fearn has made these available for all Cllrs to read. Cllr Dave Manning had an interest in reading these. Another meeting is to be held by KCC as this meeting did not conclude anything.

## **Visitors Time Report from PCSO Lindsay Woods**

This included an update on the parking meeting on the 9th March. A request has been submitted regarding the lorry weight for the area & signs are to be replaced. This request has been put in but PC Warren Jarvis is on holiday at present so when he returns this will be followed up. A new Sergeant running the neighbourhood team - Sergeant Daniel Worthington, he should be in his chair & updated by the end of this month (March 2009).

Lindsay is currently in the process of assessing the new estates with the developers as the parking issue around the streets is just becoming uncontrolled. It's not suitable for people to park on pavement & it's not suitable for vehicles not to park on pavement otherwise it blocks the road. Lindsay has taken it to her inspector now because she really doesn't know what the answer is.

Lindsay has been advised that because over 80% of people use their garages as storage rather than parking ALL new developments that were due to have garages has been edited & removed, some will still have driveways & allocated single spaces but that's it. However she's not sure if this policy came in time to effect the Hillreed development due. If anyone knows could they let her know because she's concerned about the parking problems this will create.

## **Stream Update**

Cllr Phil Fearn spoke to Graham Tuff over concerns that people could slip down. Advised was looking into a hard surface to make this safe.

## **Business of the Council**

A letter of resignation has been received by the Chairman from the Parish Clerk.

## **Planning**

Countrystyle Recycling notification sent to invite Councillors to look at site & processing plant. Iwade Parish Council will not be attending the meeting.

Indian Take-away. The public are blaming the PC for it not being passed through the planning department. The PC only recommended the 10pm closing after letters & email complaints from neighbouring residents. The final decision was taken by SBC planning department & not Iwade Parish Council.

A Cllr suggested that residents are made aware of the agenda prior to the next meeting where planning applications are to be discussed. Giving residents the opportunity to attend the PC meeting to view any concerns they may have.
