holding a card-making session led by Hilary Foulds, a 'different' quiz, a surprise 'celebratory' guest and may be thinking about a Spring picnic.




kitchen. Forensic police advise the bodies had been there for thirty years. This story has many twists and turns and is utterly absorbing.

"LET ME BE AS GOLD"

In the current TV series "The Gold" about the Brinks Mat robbery, there is a scene where the stolen pure gold is smelted and mixed with other metals. For the gold is too pure to sell on the open market, but when mixed with other metals its true value can be disguised.

There's something sad in that scene, not just in seeing such pure gold being tarnished by sheer human greed, but in the impact on the lives of those involved in that robbery. For the life they hoped for from that theft doesn't become reality. Something beautiful, rather like Paradise Lost, is destroyed and tarnished; not just the gold, but human lives wasted. Isn't that true for so much in the world, in our lives? Just look around. How easily we tarnish God's good gifts, the beauty of this planet we share and the potential of each human life?

This season of Lent started with the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert where the mettle of his character and calling was thoroughly tested, smelted if you like. In the cauldron of those days in the wilderness when the sense of hunger was real, the shortcuts to selfserving power, wealth and significance were seductively laid before him. Yet as Jesus resists the temptation for these things to divert the course of his life and mission, what emerges from this desert smelting is a life that is like pure, untarnished gold.

What is the point of giving up things for Lent? Giving up something like chocolate may help us shed a few pounds (in weight & money!). Yet is this not in fact a time when God calls us to shed much more, to let him smelt our lives, so that the true gold in our hearts may emerge? Is this not a time when we allow God to help us let go of those unhelpful habits, attitudes and behaviours, that may bind us preventing us from living fruitfully as he always intended us to live? Will we let God purify our hearts so we may be as gold? Blessings
