First and foremost, community is our key word. We're not a business, and have been set up by the Trustees of The Barn after listening to residents who have suggested the need for a micro-pub in the village. We are about real ale and craft beer, and will be using local breweries as much as possible. We will also have a small selection of wines and spirits, as well as cider at times. We have already found the network of micro-pub and microbrewery owners a real help in assisting us to get up and running, and we are indebted to them for their help and advice. We are always open to suggestions, help and advice from anyone so we can make this a success. We want customers to be part of what we are doing and will also be sharing on FB (Search: The Shepherd's Crook) which beers we are considering and to then give you the opportunity to vote for what you would like to see available for that month.



The Iwade Barn is a community facility managed by the Iwade at the Barn Trust and the pop-up micro-pub evenings are run and staffed by the trustees on a voluntary basis. All profits go back into the charity for the running and maintenance of the Barn, and to keep the Barn free of charge for community groups to use, and costs low for residents to hire.

Our first, 'trial', run was on December 14th and we followed that with an official first night on January 11th. Thank you to everyone who came along and supported us on both those evenings. We hope you had a great time, we certainly did!!

We have already had beers from Faversham, Whitstable and Tonbridge on offer and will continue to support local microbreweries as far as is possible.

We are also excited to be working with Try Taste Love who will be offering some of their delicious home-cooked food (Beef Chilli, Veg Chilli and Hot Dogs) at our next event on February 15th.





IWADE PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - Wednesday 11 December 2019

Visitors/Public Time

Visitors – A resident, representing the Iwade Patient Participation Group (IPPG), raised the issue of car parking at the surgery, the Clerk on their behalf had approached the Village Hall seeking their help with using 5/6 spaces, but this was difficult with the daytime usage of the hall. The Chair and Vice-Chair agreed to meet with the gentleman on Friday to look at possible alternatives.

County and Borough Councillors – County Cllr. Whiting reported he had received positive comments about DMC and Iwade Health Centre. Has received complaints about parking in various parts of the village. Money has come through from Government to carry out work to the Grovehurst Interchange. He is trying to encourage the planting of wildflowers in various places, tied in with KCC sorting out its Climate Change policy May next year.

Community Warden/PCSO – the Community Warden reported - Parking outside school, he and Parking Wardens have made a presence outside. Has sent an email to the facilities manager regarding the footpath in front of the car park entrance, as requested by the school, is awaiting a response. Will also speak to the highways Steward about this. Youths gathering in bus shelter, burned something in there looks like plastic dog bag? When speaking to residents about this there is so much not being reported to police because when I ask the police they don't know. Meeting with Youth House in Milton Regis and seeing whether they would do outreach work in Iwade and what programs they offer. Running surgeries first Friday of each month at 2.00 p.m. at Mews Brewhouse, will join PCSO when he holds his surgeries. Until new year working in Leysdown on Wednesdays.

The PCSO sent written report – Report of youths throwing a plant inside a shop – patrol attended and criminal damage report taken. Youth seen hanging around a vehicle in Redwing Avenue – PCSO attended, took details and CSU are currently dealing with named youth. Various reports of nuisance vehicles in Ridham Dock area – liaising with various departments to form an action plan to deal with these incidents. Two windows smashed on vehicle parked in Woodpecker Drive – PCSO attended and spoke to owner

of vehicle. Damage looked to be made by a catapult; Criminal damage report submitted. Reports of youths throwing mud at vehicles – patrol attended but no youths found. Vehicle stolen from address in Sheerstone – crime report taken. Report of two young males shooting in woodland with air rifle – patrol attended by no-one found. Vehicle and house damaged on Sanderling Way – criminal damage report taken.

Finally, leaflets were put on vehicles parked on the pavement in The Street two weeks ago, reminding drivers to be considerate when parking. Since then, a few vehicles have been observed to be parking less on the pavement, meaning there is more space to get past.

Matters Arising from the Minutes

Drains, School Lane – County Cllr. M. Whiting – Awaiting response from KCC.

Parish Councillor Vacancies – Members welcomed Paul Di Fede to the Parish Council, he duly signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and took up his post.

School Entrance – See above, Community Warden awaiting response from School.

20 mph Zone – County Councillor Whiting agreed to fund two speed surveys. If the mean speed averages 28 mph then we can go ahead with lines and signs – don't need more buildouts, which are costly. However, it appears that although Bobbing Parish Council was not approached for funding for the same Scheme in The Meads, Iwade will need to find money, this could be costly, particularly as the Scheme will need a TRO. Clerk to advise Cllr. Whiting that we would like the speed surveys and to approach Upchurch Parish Council (who are going down the same route) to see how they are progressing.

19/505642/FULL: 63 Stangate Drive Iwade Sittingbourne Kent ME9 8TQ: Erection of a single storey side extension and a loft conversion with 3no. roof lights – no objections.

18/506677/HYBRID: Halfway Egg Farm Featherbed Lane Sittingbourne Kent ME9 8RA: Hybrid application - Planning permission is sought for change of use of

existing dwelling house to replacement farm shop with office above, and conversion of toilet block to farm produce store (167 sqm) and Outline planning permission is sought for demolition of existing agricultural buildings and farm shop, erection of up to 19 dwellings, erection of implement store, associated access road, parking, pedestrian footpath and landscaping (access and layout being sought only)- Agreed no further comments to raise on this application.

19/505921/FULL: Erection of a single storey side extension: 3 Shelduck Close Iwade ME9 8WH – no objections.

Projects/Project Updates

Festive Lights – A very successful event supported by Gala Lights, Iwade Can Sing, the Village Hall Committee (Lantern Parade) and Elite Dance Company. The Snow Machine was a big hit. Sadly, although the star worked before the ceremony, it did not light on the night. It cannot be repaired before Christmas, but Members agreed to look at this in the New Year.

New Projects 2020/21 – Agreed to look at possibly extending lights down Sheppey Way; Planting Wildflowers to tie in with 'Kent's Plan Bee' – Kent County Council's Pollinator Action Plan and to look at installing a Village Sign on the Gateway entrance, Sheppey Way (Sandling Road end).

Reports from Representatives

Hall – The Lantern Parade was a huge success. All tickets sold within 20 minutes for Santa's Grotto. Bookings good.

Iwade Health Centre welcomes two new members of staff to Iwade Health Centre. ElandriKapp. Elandri has joined the team as Junior Pharmacist. She will be supporting Gemma Battrum our Pharmacist Practitioner. Elandri will be carrying out medication reviews, and holding face-to-face discussions with patients regarding their medication. Practice-based pharmacists work as part of the general practice team to resolve day-to-day medicine issues and consult with, and treat patients directly. This includes providing extra help to manage long-term conditions, they provide leadership on medicines optimisation and quality improvement. Pharmacists can offer holistic reviews of complex medication -looking at physical health, mental health, and specialist medicines together, and increasingly, use independent prescribing to add value. Iwade Health Centre, will have a new member of staff dealing with Mental Health. Scott Jones, Community Psychiatric Nurse will shortly be joining the team at Iwade and will possibly also have domiciliary visits for those in need of this service. A community psychiatric nurse is based in the community rather than a hospital. They are often patients' key workers within the mental health system and are often the first port of call for further advice, support and referrals.
