





Back in November, Iwade Tours

for an afternoon of good oldfashioned Christmas entertainment





NEW YEARS' MESSAGE FROM KEVIN MCKENNA MP SITTINGBOURNE AND SHEPPEY

As 2025 begins, I wanted to reflect on what's been achieved together since my election last July, both locally and nationally. It's been a busy six months, with much more to do, but I'm excited to keep working hard for our communities in Iwade and across Sittingbourne and Sheppey.

Since July, I've met with residents, held surgeries, including one at the Woolpack, hosted coffee mornings, and supported hundreds of people with casework. I'm particularly proud to have secured a new banking hub for Sheerness, giving easier access to personal and business banking without the need to travel miles. We've also secured £2.07 million for tackling homelessness in Swale and £2 million for an HGV park in Queenborough, which will boost the local economy and improve conditions for drivers. On top of that, I've raised the issue of anti-social behaviour on our high streets in Parliament, pressing for more funding and support for local policing.

Nationally, I've been working with Labour to deliver meaningful change. I voted to crack down on polluting companies through the Water (Special Measures) Bill, supported measures to create a publicly owned Great British Energy company. backed the Employment Rights Bill to improve conditions for workers, and supported Labour's budget, which raised the minimum wage for over 5,300 people across Swale and increased funding for schools, family hubs, and policing.

One issue that remains close to home is the poor mobile signal in Iwade. Like many of you, I've found that while my phone claims to have signal, I can't make calls or load webpages. Ofcom's data says coverage is adequate, but it's clear this doesn't reflect reality. I've met with Chris Bryant the Minister responsible for mobile and internet coverage. Who has pushed Ofcom to take a closer look at their data to ensure it matches what's actually happening on the ground.

There's much more to do, but I'm confident that together we can keep making Sittingbourne and Sheppey a better place to live and work.




IWADE READING AND BOOK GROUP

Appendix A - Local Stories

- As winter is in full-fledge the volume of nuisance vehicles speeding through Iwade and underneath the Sheppey Crossing has plummeted, and only one such call was noted at the very beginning of the month. The CCTV underneath the crossing is effective in identifying the vehicles and Section 59 ASB warnings are sent out. Where the cameras do not cover, obtaining registrations is vital in prosecuting the offenders.
- Two instances of poaching are noted to having occurred on the outskirts of Iwade, although no game is said to have been taken. Usually, the offenders are spooked prior to Police arrival but I am pleased to note that in both incidents registrations were taken and passed to the Rural Task Force who are the best team to tackle rural crime. any of you will have noticed the scaffolding that was installed before Christmas to allow the wooden shingles to be replaced on the Church Tower roof. By the time this issue is delivered, the work should be completed and the new shingles installed.

The church council and vicar of All Saints want to express our sincerest gratitude to all individuals who have given donations towards the cost of this work. In addition, we are grateful for grants that we have been awarded from Cllr Mike Baldock and Cllr Mike Dendor, The National Churches Trust, Friends of Kent Churches, The Doubleday Trust, Queenborough Fisheries and Iwade Rocks.

The original cost we anticipated did not include the work to replace the lightning conductor which we discovered was detached, but we have raised enough funds

to enable that work to be done also while the scaffolding was still there. Our fundraising efforts continue as we have discovered repairs are needed for the South Aisle roof, which will cost a further £10,000. Donations or other offers of support are very welcome. 
IWADE PARISH COUNCIL & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS



• Statement from Southern Water – email 04.12 – Following a meeting held by the Parish Council with Southern Water and KCC, Southern Water issued a statement which covers the facts already known to the parish council and residents; the investigation carried out showed no leaks on their assets. Members note that water is starting to pool outside of Plantation Court again, and the Clerk has reported this to Southern Water and KCC. Members agreed that KCC need to investigate this issue. **Action: Clerk**
