



Dear friends,

'... think on these things.' - Paul to the Philippians Ch 4: v 8

Life has been handing us lots of challenges lately. I'm tempted to start listing them, but I'll spare us. There is a very real risk to health of allowing all the troubles of the world to weigh us down. My wife and children have been warning me about this recently, as I'm an avid Facebook debater with transatlantic connections and wide interests – lots of turbulent waters to navigate, while trying not to be overwhelmed.

At the same time, there are sources of ordinary human enjoyment to turn to. If we have any relationships, hobbies, or interests that are waiting for renewal or refreshing, now is the time family, friends, neighbours, people at work, or anyone just met along the way.
