Iwade Nature and Conservation Group

The Iwade Nature and Conservation Group has now officially been set up. The group has been set up to look after the wildlife we have in the village and preserve the natural environment that we have available to us. We are lucky that we have so much nature and wildlife right in the middle of the village and it will be good to educate people as to what different species we have here and preserve areas such as the Orchard in Woodpecker Drive for future generations. We have many endangered and protected species living right in the centre of the village!

Thank you to James Grundy who donated £50 to get things started. With the money we purchased a Butterfly House, Bumble Bee log, Ladybird Tower and Bird's Nest which have now been placed in the orchard. Unfortunately the Bumblebee log seems to have disappeared; please keep an eye out for anyone damaging things – they are there for everyone to enjoy. With the remaining money we purchased an insect identification book, pond dipping book, fishing net, and an insect collecting kit for each of the three nursery schools in the village and we hope the children will get much enjoyment out of them.

We have also been lucky to have been awarded a grant of £250 thanks to our Borough Councillor Ben Stokes. We hope

to buy professional pond dipping kits that the nurseries and other groups could have use of and will be making up some signs giving people info about the area and the species that are there. If anyone has ideas of other things that we could do please get in touch and let us know.

Thanks to the 40 – 50 residents that got involved with the pond clean-up that was arranged with the Environment Agency. The EA were very impressed with the community spirit in Iwade and are continuing to work on the pond when they can. Now the pond is more accessible there will soon be a pond dipping platform installed for all to use. A Day in the life of our PCSO,

Aaron Harris By Murray Crundwell

Since becoming the PCSO for our village at the start of this year, Aaron Harris has been keeping himself busy in what he describes as "a lovely place to live with a low crime rate, of which the community play a big role in."

Aaron joined the police force two and half years ago after studying Public Services at Mid Kent College, achieving a PASS grade, and applying for the role of a PCSO via the Kent Police website. He was then required to complete 8 weeks of training at Kent Police College in Maidstone, followed by a minimum of 10 weeks on-the-job training with an existing PCSO.

Having been signed off after the mandatory 10 weeks training, Aaron was assigned the ward/area of Gillingham North. This is considered one of the busiest areas in Medway and his role mainly involved patrolling the High Street and dealing with a lot of shoplifting issues.

After a force restructure at the start of this year, Aaron was moved from Gillingham North and given the ward of Iwade and Lower Halstow. The drop in activity and level of calls came as a shock but it is a challenge that he is tackling head-on. The Iwade Observer spoke to our PCSO to get an insight into what his daily role consists of.

Aaron's day will start by checking emails and messages to ensure he has no jobs/incidents to deal with and also to ensure any residents of Iwade that want to get in touch are contacted at the earliest opportunity to discuss their issues/concerns. He then goes to a briefing where the Sergeant gives out any work/jobs he would like us to deal with.

A high visibility patrol of his ward is next on the agenda and after making his way to Iwade he will speak to residents and conduct visits to victims of crime, vulnerable residents and local shops/businesses. A patrol in and around the school and start and finish times is also important. The level of calls and incidents received effects where his patrols take him.

The end of his shift is set aside for completing paperwork including writing statements, putting crime reports on the system, updating victims and completing his pocket notebook for the day.

As you can tell, the role of PCSO is not one to be taken lightly and the daily tasks undertaken by Aaron are what contribute to Iwade being a safe and friendly place to live. 30mph Sign

A new speed indicator sign has been installed in Sheppey Way, Iwade. The sign was requested by Cllr Mike Whiting, who represents Iwade at Kent County Council, and paid for from his Highway Grant Funds. Mike said, "Many residents



and the Parish Council asked for something be done to slow down

traffic through the village, and I have seen for myself cars driving too fast. The pinch points and build outs are not as effective as they might be, with some motorists speeding up to get through them before oncoming vehicles. The signs, which are effective elsewhere in the county, will remind speeding drivers to slow down to 30mph."

Parish Council Notes taken from the meeting of 11th July

Prior to the monthly meeting the Vice-Chair, Cllr. Jones, who chaired the meeting in the absence of Cllr. Plumb, welcomed Tasha Gibbs, Emergency Planning Assistant at Kent County Council to the meeting.

Tasha explained that she is part of a team running training sessions on flooding in Kent, and as a follow on to this training she is offering to assist Parish Councils in creating their own Emergency Plan. She went on to comment that although the programme was concerning flooding, and this was of concern to resident in Iwade due to the stream, if an Emergency Plan is created it can cover other incidents, such as fire affecting many properties, as well. Some of the things the Parish Council needs to consider and build into their plan is to identify a key building - somewhere for evacuated people to find refuge; escape routes - roads might be blocked; liaison with the main Emergency Services and others - this will involve the creation of a telephone tree; medical assistance, blankets, food, water; the list goes on. Kent County Council has produced a template and guidance document for creating an Emergency Plan

- During the past month he has dealt with many issues, including fuel theft, and complaints about parking at Cormorant Drive and Sheerstone. He stated that Swale Borough Council's Enforcement Officer has been looking at parking at the school and is wondering why parents don't use the Village Hall car park. It was suggested that the school put out a note to new parents regarding this car park. Finally he mentioned that Amicus Horizon is undertaking some 'Torch' walks around town; one goes from Iwade (he believes this is in the last week of July).

Solicitor/Planning Permission

- This matter was raised at the recent Finance Committee meeting, when it was proposed that the Council employs 'Jarmans', a firm of Solicitors based in Sittingbourne.
