Iwade Village Clean Up

Date for proposed Village Clean Up is Saturday 19th May 2007
Proposed Time is 10am to 2.00pm
- Meeting at the corner of Woodpecker Drive by the Village Hall at 10.00am.
Possibility of tea coffee/squash being served in Ickle Pickles at 12 midday for all helpers.

This is the second year the Village Clean up day has taken place and the plan is to focus on the areas that residents have concerns about around the village. This means volunteers will be split to work in the areas that they have a personal interest and hopefully converging in the centre of the village at the end of the clear up day.

The Parish Council are aware that a great deal of the jobs being done should be done by Swale Council but the little bit residents can do to help can only be better for the village. The benefits out way the disadvantages in the Parish Councils opinion.

Parish Clerk has already contacted some of the groups in the village to see if they are willing to help such as the Iwade Herons and Beavers/ Cubs.

Main tasks in all areas we are aiming to cover:

1. Picking up of all litter, rubbish etc
2. Sweeping of all pathways
3. Tidying of all grass edgings that border pathways, roadside etc
4. Cleaning of Path Signs, Road Signs etc
5. Identifying any areas that need attention by a specialist e.g. Large pot holes in road, broken fencing etc.

As well as the above there are areas for each team that need particular attention which are noted under each team brief.

Team 1: East Team

Starting from roundabout off A249 working along Grovehurst Road to join up with Team 2 (South Team) at Garage and then both teams work down the Street until reach Village Park. Entry gates need attention.

Team 2: South Team

Start at entry gates to village by Health Centre and work towards Village Centre joining up with Team 1 at Garage and then carry on working down to finish at Village Centre. Entry gates need attention.

Team 3: West Team

Start at top of School Lane including Playing Field and work down School Lane to meet at Village Park.

Team 4: North Team

Start at entry gates to village on Ferry Road and work inwards towards Village Centre meeting other teams at Village Park. Entry gates need a lot of attention.

If some groups complete their areas very quickly they can join forces with other teams or look at other areas off of the main roads that are not being covered on the clean up day.

Obviously the number of groups is dependent upon the number of people that appear. Iwade has again been put into the Village of the Year Competition so the village needs as many volunteers as possible to help.

The Street, Iwade


Southern Water intend to undertake a mains renewal scheme and in order to carry out these works it will be



Iwade WI met on February 21st in the village hall.

Once we had done the business part of the meeting, decided which members would be accepting Bobbing and Upchurch WI's birthday invitations and discussed all the other WI activities planned for the coming months, we were joined by Ursula Atkins who gave her talk "Fraulein Tomm-Tomm, Childhood Memories of an Evacuee in Germany and Austria".

The subject sounded as if it might be a serious and dour experience.

It was anything but. Ursula spoke for a full hour, without any reference to notes, and took us on a journey to her childhood in Germany through the war years. You could have listened to Ursula all evening without being bored.

She told us how her father had gone off to the war, leaving their mother to cope with trying to bring up her and her younger brother with all the deprivations and difficulties of war.

Eventually, the town decided to evacuate its children to somewhere safer and a young Ursula found herself on a train with no idea of where she was going. Strangely, her mother had decided to keep Ursula's brother at home, because, she supposed, he was so young. All alone in the world, she found herself placed in a children's home.

It was interesting to hear how so many of the experiences of living through the war in Germany

mirrored the social difficulties in the UK.

Ursula has published a book about her wartime experiences, aptly titled "Fraulein Tomm-Tomm, and kindly signed copies for anyone who wished to buy a copy.

We held a competition at this meeting, Something from Austria or Germany which was won by Lily Lammas. Joy White won the Flower of the Month competition for a beautiful pink Camellia.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 21 March at 7.30 in the village hall. We have local historian Helen Atkinson coming to speak on "Sittingbourne, a Coaching Town". The competition is for a photograph of Sittingbourne, new or old.

At our meeting on 18 April, again in the village hall, we are joined by writer and journalist Martin Gurdon. He will be speaking about his Travels with his

Iwade Parish Council

At the January Parish Council Items taken from the February Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday 13th February 2007

Recycling Scheme in Iwade

Due to the poor start from the Recycling Scheme at the beginning of the year, it has been noted that residents are not recycling as much as they did before. Cllr Phil Fearn requested that the Parish Council highlight this in the next edition of the Iwade Village News and on the website. This was agreed by all Councillors present.

Sewer Pipe in School Lane

Iwade Parish Council had concerns regarding the inadequate sewerage pipe in School Lane. This pipe erupted three times last year, spewing raw sewerage onto the footpath and into the road and some into the nearby drain that runs into the stream.

The Chairman check to make sure that Councillors had received the copy letters from Cllr Ben Stokes regarding this situation. All confirmed that they had either by email or by post.

Councillor Ben Stokes advised the Parish Council that after numerous letters sent to Southern Water and the Environment Agency they have succumbed to the pressure. Cllr Ben Stokes was pleased to advise that the sewage pumping main pipe from the School Lane Pumping station is being upsized from 150mm to 300mm diameter. As previous reported the

capacity of the existing main was previously identified as the cause of some of the recent incidents.

Due the mains burst, the first section of the main to be replaced is from School Lane to Woodpecker Drive (approx 110 meters). Work is currently planned to begin on this section in March, subject to obtaining permission for traffic management and access.

Cllr Stokes informed the Council that Southern Water have stated that letters to residents who will be affected by the work will be sent out once details have been finalized.

The Parish Council wished to thank Borough Councilor Ben Stokes for all the hard work and commitment he had put into this project and were pleased with the outcome.

Cllr Phil Hyde suggested that pictures of the area should be taken before the work started so the Parish Council has evidence of the state of the area before any major work starts.

Village Hall Fees

The Parish Clerk advised the Parish Council that the fees for the hire of the hall for the Parish Council had gone up by 33%. The Clerk also brought to the attention of the Council that the following clubs had approached the Parish Council for assistance due to this increase: Beavers/Cubs, Iwade Parent and Toddler and Iwade WI.

The Parish Council agreed in principal to pay for the hall hire for this clubs, but would wait until the actual invoices were received by the Parish Clerk before any payment was made. Clerk to write to the village hall

committee requesting invoices.

Cllr Lisa Older and Cllr Sue Dowling asked the Parish Clerk to find out when the next Village Hall Committee meeting was as they would consider attending the meetings to see what improvements/ suggestions could be put forward to make sure the village hall was being used to its full capacity, as at the present moment they were aware that a lot of restrictions were being put on hall hires which was making the hall not appealing to potential hirers.

Dates for the Annual Parish Council Meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting.

The date for the Annual Parish Meeting is to be scheduled for 17th April 2007 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

The Chairman advised the Council that this is an opportunity for residents of the village who are on the register of electors to receive an update on the latest planning and development proposals, to ask questions and to raise questions on any subject. However the Chairman reminded Council members that new residents who were not on the electors register are welcome as observers but unable to raise questions.

The date for the Annual Parish Council Meeting will be held before the monthly Parish Council meeting on 8th May 2007 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall

Grass areas in Ferry Road

Cllr Phil Hyde advised the Parish Council that the grass areas in front of Plantation Mews was still be parked on by residents who live in Ferry Road, although the bollards had been put in place

this had not deter these residents and the grass verges were destroyed.

It was agreed that the clerk would get in touch with Highways to see if the Parish Council could put a pigeon fence around these verges and plant bulbs.

Missing 30mph signs

Cllr Phil Fearn advised the Parish Council that even after a year of chasing Kent County Council Highways for new replacement 30mph signs nothing had been done. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Michael Summit advising him again of the missing speed signs and see if Parish Council can purchase their own and get them installed.

Annual Village Clean Up

Cllr Phil Hyde advised the Parish Council that due to the success of last years village clean up this activity will be done again. Unlike last year where the Clean Up helpers were too thinly spread, volunteers would work on selected areas chosen by themselves which would benefit the area they lived in..

It was agreed that the Parish Clerk would write to the Beavers/ Cubs and Iwade Herons to see if they would be willing to help this year.

It was agreed that due to the Village of Year judgement being in the beginning of June the Village Clean up would take place on Saturday 19th May 2007 from 10am to 2pm. Iwade Parish Council would provide the equipment again and the Clerk to start advertising this project in the Iwade Village News and Website.

All Saints Church

At this time of Lent, as we concentrate again on the events of Easter, let us look to the glorious conclusion of Easter Sunday certainly, but not forget that we all have to pass through Good Friday to get there.
